## How to control the playing speed

The book is equipped with the audio tracks. The address of the home page of the book on the Internet, where audio files are available for listening and downloading, is listed at the beginning of the book on the bibliographic description page before the copyright notice.

We recommend using free **VLC media player** to control the playing speed. You can control the playing speed by decreasing or increasing the speed value on the button of the VLC media player's interface.

**Android users:** After installing VLC media player, click an audio track at the top of a chapter or on the home page of the book if you read a paper book. When prompted choose "Open with VLC". If you experience difficulties opening audio tracks with VLC, change default app for music player. Go to Settings→Apps, choose VLC and click "Open by default" or "Set default".

**Kindle Fire users:** After installing VLC media player, click an audio track at the top of a chapter or on the home page of the book if you read a paper book. Complete action using →VLC.

**iOS users:** After installing VLC media player, copy the link to an audio track at the top of a chapter or on the home page of the book if you read a paper book. Paste it into Downloads section of VLC media player. After the download is complete, go to All Files section and start the downloaded audio track.

**Windows users:** After installing VLC media player, right-click an audio track at the top of a chapter or on the home page of the book if you read a paper book. Choose "Open with→VLC media player".

**MacOS users:** After installing VLC media player, right-click an audio track at the top of a chapter or on the home page of the book if you read a paper book, then download it. Right-click the downloaded audio track and choose "Get info". Then in the "Open with" section choose VLC media player. You can enable "Change all" to apply this change to all audio tracks.
